

Sharing God's comfort with the terminally-ill, their loved ones and caregivers.

ecently, in my role as Hospice Chaplain, I visited the family of an actively-dying patient. All were devout members of a mainline 'Christian' denomination. This in and of itself is not unusual since 71% of Wisconsin residents identify themselves as 'Christian.' Having lived here now for over a decade, I encounter considerable confusion among this 'Christian' population, most often in the form of syncretism. Syncretism occurs when non-biblical, even pagan, ideas get mixed in with Christianity. And so it was with this family.



As their loved one neared death a family member opened a window in the patient's room. This was *not* for letting in fresh air, I learned. The open window was to help their loved one's spirit depart freely, preventing it becoming trapped in the room.

I listened politely but I couldn't help but think about remote parts of the world where I've lived. Animistic tribal beliefs, superstitions and fear of ancestral spirits reign supreme in those places but in Wisconsin—in a 'Christian' society? Syncretism is truly without borders.

The open window betrayed a distorted view of God—that God somehow needed the help of mortals to control the spirit world.

Sitting with the grieving family, I gently shared these words from Isaiah 40, "Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth." I explained how the Christian faith is anchored in the eternal, all-powerful Creator-Owner of the universe. Long ago, King David prayed, "Before the mountains were born or you brought forth the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God."

One might ask, why start a gospel presentation focusing on God's all-powerful and eternal attributes? The answer is simple. Only an eternal God can make and keep eternal promises. And God promises those who trust Him, "...I am with you; do not be dismayed,

for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand... When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you... For I am the Lord, your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior."

Only an *eternal* God can make and keep *eternal* promises. The truth of God's eternal, all-powerful existence is foundational to the saving power of His gospel through Jesus Christ. The scripture is clear, "He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life."

While I shared these and other scriptures with my little audience, fresh puffs of air from the open window gently caressed the curtains. I silently prayed the truth of God would similarly move fresh and vital upon the hearts of my precious listeners.

You know, I am so glad our eternal destiny is not dependent on someone opening a window when we die. Aren't you?
